<u>COMMUNICATION</u> – Minkler stated the new portable radios were given to the chiefs last night. He requested to meet with chief's after meeting because he has some questions and or concerns he would like to address.

- 1. There are 18 classes scheduled for spring. Summer class for firefighter 1 &2 will be taught again.

<u>VEHICLE REPAIR/NEW APPARATUS</u> –Convery stated the new construction for Ocean Beach boat is progressing more rapidly than expected. Autenrieth asked the progress of the survey for existing boat. Chief Calvo stated it has been scheduled for next week.

REPORTS OF FIRE OFFICERS

DISTRICT CHIEF SEAMAN- (See inserted report) The Lakewood fire was discussed with an update on Firefighter Brian Sauers.

<u>CO. 1- CHIEF VICIDOMINI</u> – Wished Commissioner Latshaw good luck at the upcoming election. Requesting the use 2517 to pick up fire extinguishers in north Jersey that are being donated to the fire academy.

Motion Autenrieth second Minkler authorizing use of 2517 to pick up equipment.

CO. 2 CHIEF CIRZ -Cirz thanked the board and District chief for the Multi-ban portables.

<u>CO. 3 CHIEF CALVO</u> – Calvo stated there was an incident on the beach Easter Sunday which was a little difficult to maneuver equipment with the dunes being ruined after storm.

<u>CO.4 CHIEF CATAPANO</u> – Catapano stated he had an opportunity to utilize the new portables and he would like to be part of the meeting. He feels he would be an asset and may be able to clear up some confusion. The police department borrowed one of the Active Shooter training kits so the training should start again.

ISLAND HEIGHTS – No representation.

SEASIDE HEIGHTS -No representation

FIRE OFFICERS ASSOCIATION – Gary Simone Jr. stated after the last officers meeting he a list was compiled of questions for the board.

- 1. Opticom- What is the status? When is the new system being installed or is it installed? Convery stated they are installing in different sections of the town. Autenrieth stated per Administrator Kubiel the County still has some intersections to complete, as for the old system if they have the parts to repair sections that are not working they will, but will not expend funds to do so since the new system will be operational soon.
- 2. Pagers- running in a depleted surplus. Is there any plan to backfill the surplus? Tutela stated as soon as the budget passes the board will move forward with purchase of pagers.
- 3. Increase to the tools and equipment budget? The concern is the amount has been the same for many years and with the increased cost of equipment they are formally requesting the amount be increased. Autenrieth stated this will be addressed at the budget meetings in September/October.
- 4. Ballot-What are the questions on the ballot? Autenrieth stated, general budget question, chief/asst. chief vehicles, the aerial for Ocean Beach, Minkler continued to state the fire academy upgrades and last the purchase of vehicles without prior approval from the voters had to be placed on the ballot because the Auditors and DCA stated no prior approval was done. Bisceglie stated the ballot questions are on the website for anyone that would like to view.
- 5. Assistant Chief vehicles? Thanked the board for placing this question on the agenda but questioned are there any plans to distribute any vehicles now. Convery/Minkler both stated this is being discussed in closed session tonight.

Convery explained Elite Fitness on Fisher Blvd has closed their doors effective March 31st so Crunch Fitness is the replacement facility. Bisceglie stated she has to complete the set up with the branch manager and will send out an email to all firefighters when they can start utilizing the facilities.

PARTICIPATION BY THE PUBLIC- Joe Catapano has several questions/statements

- 1. The board has contracts with Island Heights and Seaside Heights where it stated they have to attend a certain amount of meetings or their check will be held, when was the last time Seaside Heights have attended out meeting? Tutela stated January. Catapano requested a copy of the contract.
- 2. Reviewing several expenditures over the past several months such as legal fees in the amount of \$27,000, where that could have bought a lot of safety equipment for the firefighters specifically bail out kits. He stated this is his opinion as a taxpayer not as the chief of East Dover.
- 3. Over the past several months' computer programs have been discussed and not one program has been utilized to the full capacity. Looking over the expenditures as a taxpayer his opinion is if one or two programs could work to their fullest capacity. The board could save thousands of dollars to be better utilized on safety equipment to protect the firefighters.
- 4. I have read a 56-page document that was sent via email. He said one item which is very concerning and asked if the board was aware of a quote "furthermore I advised if the fire sub-code official is removed from the joint board that it will probably wind up in a legal battle and I assured him that the fire department would not support him or any of the council members in the next election." He says the fire department should not be brought into their political battle. Commissioner Minkler asked about what programs are not working. Catapano said you cannot

utilize any program to its fullest capability.

Jesse Sipe had several questions:

1. GRC ruling: Asked who represents the District No.1 board for the complaint 2019-163 brought to the general records council: Kubiel vs Toms River Board of Fire Commissioners. Attorney Appleby stated her firm represents. Sipe feels there is a conflict with her firm and complainant and that is why special council was hired initially. He asked if the board recalls a resolution being passed that relates to this complaint that any commissioner present or past would be represented by special council. Latshaw, Convery and Autenrieth stated yes. Attorney Appleby stated this is still an open case and if Mr. Sipe feels this is too egregious that he is able to hire an attorney. Mr. Sipe responded he is requesting special council to represent him paid by the board as stated in a previous resolution. Robert Varady to be exact. Lengthy discussion followed.

- 2. Has the board considered consolidation of districts? Convery stated no! Sipe asked if the boards own property together why are they acting independently. Convery replied District No.2 was the first to make decisions without the knowledge of District No.1 therefore left District No.1 no other alternative then to act independently to protect themselves. Lengthy discussion followed.
- 3. Commissioner Latshaw came to the firehouses last night for support to run and there were several questions that could not be answered. If the budget were to fail it will no longer go to the township but to the DCA, is that accurate? Convery responded that is an option. He asked if commissioners of both District 1 and District No.2 should be involved in each other elections because the same phone number for both Ray Latshaw and the candidates for District No.2 were on the propaganda. Commissioner Convery admitted that was his phone number but was definitely a mistake, he is here to support Commissioner Ray Latshaw.

Commissioner Minkler wanted it stated for the record that District No.1 got called to the town for a meeting with Township officials about the fire sub code official, present were Lou Amoruso, Attorney McGuckin, three councilmen, the Mayor, Attorney Appleby, Administrator Kubiel, himself, Latshaw, Administrator Carson, Commissioners Geoghegan, Britton and Attorney Braslow via phone. The first thing the town stated was their efficiency study that they should take back the fire-sub-code official. Secondly they did not want to give tenure to Mr. Esposito. District No.2 response if we allow you to pick another employee will you keep it in the bureau. District No.1 position was why would District No.1 allow the town to pick one of our employees when we have a current shared service agreement in place that states the boards are to appoint not the town. District No.1 filed a tort notice of claim which protects the board if any employees sue them for breach of contract. In addition, at the last joint meeting, District No.1 offered District No.2 to take the fire sub code official and to split fire prevention. District No.1 has asked for the efficiency study three times with a response that it does not exist. (lengthy discussion followed)

John Lightbody Jr gave a history on the fire sub-code official and it origin. He stated this should stay within the fire bureau. He is appalled this has been moved and suggested Inspector John Novak be appointed to the position because it does not necessarily have to be the chief of the bureau. Breaking up the fire bureau is not the answer. (discussion followed on this subject)

He continued to state if the position had to be removed from the Bureau, Bryant Curry is a great pick by the Mayor. Great job by him for sending out letter to chiefs stating he has an open door policy if anyone has any questions.

He also voiced his disappointment as it relates to arriving on a scene of a fire and the chief inspector/chief investigator had facial hair, when asked what that was on his face his response was I don't mask up. District No.1 has a facial hair policy and all should abide by this policy. He recommended the board look into 2C 40:18. (Discussion followed)

Travis Veth expressed his dissatisfaction with the fire dispatchers and how a call was addressed. His opinion is they are purposely by-passing Silverton EMS. He stated a dispatch supervisor was hired and he should start doing his job. Another issue was that the fire dispatchers are going to the county. Latshaw stated that was just suggested and he did not say that. Convery stated they do not want to go to county. He addressed Commissioner Minkler and said in discussion on the fire-sub code that because of the decision making of this board the fire sub code official no longer is within the bureau and they should start make decisions that are progressive for the fire department for the safety for all.

John Lightbody Jr. stated he was a district chief during Superstorm sandy and held the position for approximately 11 months but then the position was redirected. He is asking for the board to reconsider given him a well-deserved ex-district chief badge.

Dan Goresh- The policy on facial hair does that go hand and hand with employees or just firefighters. Convery stated if they are fighting fires everyone should follow the policy of the board

and this will be addressed. Tutela stated he will review policy and make sure all entities are addressed in this policy.

Andy Goresh- asked the status of the radio system upgrade? He thought initially the town was going to bond for the radios. Tutela stated this is no longer happening. Why are the commissioners still on board if radios have to now be purchased by the board? District Chief stated because by 2525 all have to be off the band. Tutela stated all emergencies have to be on the 700 frequency. Minkler stated we will continue to be part of the meetings to be in the loop. (Discussion followed)

Jesse Sipe stated in closed session he sees the board will be discussing the GRC order and if his name is being discussed or has been in the past that he is requesting a rice notice. Attorney Appleby stated he is not an employee. Mr. Sipe stated that all firefighters are considered employees.
