ATTORNEY REPORT- Attorney Koutsouris stated there is an investigative report that is going to be considered on the agenda for tonight. A rice notice was issued and wanted to go over what a rice notice actually is. A rice notice is required to be given if an employee of an employer in public employment is going to be disciplined. The discussions by the governing body, if any, has to be optionally held in private or public. You as the governing body have the option to discuss a matter of employee in open session and by law do not even have to notify the employee of such because it is on agenda. But if the board decides they want to talk about this employee in private session, you as the governing body must now send employee a rice notice. When you send a rice notice to an employee who is potentially subject to discipline that you are going to talk about them in closed session it is informing them they will be discussed. The employee then has the right to request the matter in open session. If the employee, after being served a rice notice, chooses not to exercise their right in open session the employee does not have the right to be present in closed session. Considering personnel matters you do not have to have a discussion, the board can say we reviewed the material and make the motion to do x. The board can call for discussion if they want but note this is not a hearing. The investigation happened there is no participation by employee unless the board decided they want it. It is simply executive action on what has been presented, there is no obligation to release any material and the board should keep the discussion as minimal as possible.

So his suggestion was to do the same. Roman stated to keep it uniformed he is in agreement with District No.2 to suspend one week without pay. Commissioner Willson wanted it on the record he is not in favor of District No.2 decision.

Motion Heroy second Duff to implement one week suspension to Richard Gorman per the investigative report.

Fire Bureau Report Joint Board of Fire Commissioners Meeting 10/08/2025

1. Public Education Van
 - a. The Public Education Unit transit van has been delivered and outfitted by the inspectors with supplies for use at events. Since then, it has already been used successfully at four events. The Bureau staff provided fire safety demonstrations at Lakeridge, including a PowerPoint presentation and fire extinguisher training, and participated in the TRPD Fall Festival with a tent and tables set up for public outreach.
2. Fire Extinguisher Training
 - a. Bureau staff have been very busy with fire extinguisher training requests, as several businesses have reached out to have us provide training. It is encouraging to see that businesses view us as an asset rather than an adversary. Our inspectors have worked hard to build positive relationships with business owners, and that effort is paying off in both compliance and in requests for employee fire safety training.
3. Toms River VA Clinic – Fire Drill
 - a. The VA Clinic on Hooper Avenue conducted a live fire drill for staff and clients. Inspector LaVigne has been in regular communication with the VA's life safety inspector from Lyons to coordinate efforts, ensuring that VA processes align with our model. The VA inspector has been addressing federal fire code concerns while also working to resolve the NJ fire code violations issued by our office. This partnership continues to grow and is moving in a positive direction.
4. Fulton Bank – Acquired Structure Drill
 - a. Fulton Bank and the Toms River Fire Department partnered to provide training opportunities. Two vacant commercial buildings on Hooper Avenue in Toms River, which had been sitting unused for several years, were made available to the fire department following discussions with Fulton Bank regarding fire code deficiencies. As part of the agreement, the Fire Bureau waived penalties in exchange for access to the buildings for training prior to their demolition. On September 9th, a Township-wide drill was held, with all six Toms River fire companies participating.
5. Fire Bureau / 105.7 The Hawk Partnership
 - a. 105.7 The Hawk has once again partnered with us to record and broadcast fire safety messages on behalf of the Toms River Fire Department. This partnership, now in its third year, is unique to our agency and continues to be an excellent way to connect with the community. The recordings took place on September 17th, with six fire safety messages completed covering the following topics: Smoke Alarms, Home Heating Safety, Cooking Safety, Holiday Safety (recorded by Inspector Kevin Britton), Plan Your Escape, and Lithium-Ion Battery Safety. These messages will air throughout the entire month of October.
6. ESO – Fire Incident Reporting and Training
 - a. Fire incident reporting has now fully transitioned to ESO. While we've encountered some minor issues, our staff has been able to work through them with support from ESO. We've also been



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meeting with the Fire Academy staff to build out the training module, which will allow us to better track firefighter certifications and academy courses. Two separate Zoom meetings with ESO have been held to discuss ideas, resolve issues, and provide feedback, this remains a work in progress. On the incident side, CAD imports have been functioning well, and inspectors are completing reports as expected. As we move forward, training at the fire officer level will be scheduled to review how ESO operates, and the specific data required for each incident.

7. Potter Training Fire Panel

- a. Assistant Chief Foster made contact with Potter Fire Alarms to pick up where Siemens left off after failing to follow through on their commitment. The regional representative from Potter met with us, along with Director Gorman, to discuss supplying the parts and equipment needed to build a functional fire alarm training environment at the Fire Academy. We had previously begun planning and purchasing components for this project under Siemens, but progress stalled when they withdrew from participation. The new Potter representative has already begun setting up equipment, and we will continue building out the system as time allows. The goal is to construct a training wall that includes both addressable and zoned fire alarm systems to provide hands-on training for firefighters and Potter sales personnel alike. This is a major step forward for our training capabilities, and we look forward to continuing this partnership with Potter.

8. Social Media

- a. Our Fire Safety Friday social media campaign is coming to an end. The initiative has been very successful, generating many positive interactions and helping us connect with the community. While the weekly posts will conclude, the concept will continue in a broader format, with specific fire safety topics addressed in greater depth but less frequently. These posts will remain current and relevant. In addition, we are preparing to transition into short video clips recorded by Bureau staff and shared across multiple platforms. This will be a learning curve, but we anticipate it will generate even stronger engagement. Several inspectors have already expressed interest in participating, and we will begin piloting this approach in the near future. More to follow.

NJDFS is moving to an Automated Record Management System with a company called CSI. It is linked to the NJ State MBOS, and KEAN Fire Portal. Individual Students will create and manage their own profile. The purpose of the portal is to allow the student to enroll into classes, access and manage learning materials, take periodic quizzes and final exams. The Eligible Organization's responsibility is to facilitate these steps. Additionally the EO must register the classes, students, and all related forms to ensure the student can complete the class successfully. The EO is then complete with the process, and the student can access their scores and certificates from the NJDFS/KEAN on line through the portal.
14. Ocean County and Monmouth County Fire Academies continue to cooperate well.

15. NJDFS Fire Official Program in fall being enrolled by D Foley.
16. The NJDFS initiative to standardize continues The NJ CSC Physical Performance Test as outlined in the NJFF Physical Fitness Manual.
17. All burn rooms are operating well.
18. Fire Academy Engine 1 is operating well.
19. The Dakota Pick Up, had brakes and PM completed.
20. The propane vapor delivery system is operating normally.
21. Video and Surveillance System is installed and fully functional to enhance safety and security on the FA and surrounding grounds.
22. Lock Down systems are operational.
23. Doug Foley continues to liaison and assist the NJ DFS and KEAN University in the review and development of code updates in the NJ UFC. It should be noted that all correspondence, which include course delivery and completion forms, all training requests, all certificate research, final examination security and delivery functions, and the KEAN /DFS site test monitor responsibilities are assigned to Doug Foley.
24. Many vendors have contracted with the FTC to deliver their programs, such as JA Montgomery, and Fire Officer Training Academy.
25. The Toms River Police continue to use the facility.
26. Toms River Public Works, Ocean County Fire Working Groups, and NJ State Forest Fire Service, Ocean Co Chiefs Association continue to use the facility.
27. Several NJ DFS special operations groups routinely meet at the FTC for regional coordination.
28. The FTC Log Book, which is a ledger of daily activities, has been introduced. The inception was on January 1, 2024, it is for review, upon request, by the commissioners and BA's.
